

'My favourite thing to play with is plasticine. You can make all sorts of things with it, cars for example. I love all of the different colours of the plasticine. I have five different pots of plasticine at the moment. I can play with it for two months. Then I'll buy some more. I also love to play with Lego. It lasts for a long, long time and is really strong. You can't break it very easily. If a bit does break, I keep it in a special drawer. Maybe I can use it for something else later.

If I have toys I don't use anymore, I

give them to other children. That way, I never throw anything away! I'm really sad that some toys are made by children in factories in poor countries. They work really hard but don't get paid much money. I think that the factory owners should give those children toys too so that they can also have some time to play. All children need time to play!' •



'What is my favourite toy? My football! I play for the hockey team but in my spare time, I play football. I play anywhere I can; in the playground at school with my class, on the field or just outside on the street. We think of all sorts of games to play with the ball, such as 'football tag' or 'football table tennis'.

Boys and girls all play together and there's no difference between us, I think. Sometimes the boys play more with their Pokemon cards and their Spiderman action dolls.

My pink and yellow football is sustainable because it's hard to break it. I think it's fine to play with toys that aren't sustainable every now and then. As long as you enjoy the toy, it's okay. I always put handy things on my wish list for presents, like a water bottle or new sports clothes. I love felt-tipped pens for drawing too!' •



'Lego is my favourite toy. I love the way you can make whatever you want. I have the normal bricks but I also have special sets, such as a Lego police and a fire station. I think my toys are the same as children's toys in other countries. Last summer, I went to Spain. The children there had the same toys as I have at home. The weather is warmer than in the Netherlands so they play more outside. I think children in poorer countries are more creative. They have less money so they think of their own games using all the things they have. If you ask me to write my wish list for presents, I would put Lego on it and I would like a comic book too.' •


